The following actions are required to achieve the above:

55. **Develop** a comprehensive four year communication strategy starting in January 2019 that includes practical measures to increase awareness and unity among Inuit;
56. **Facilitate** a formal program of professional exchange between member countries;
57. **Develop** greater awareness and understanding of Inuit through participation in international fora and through media;
58. **Support** communities who are working to preserve their original place names.
