THE CURRENT AND FUTURE OF THE U.S. SENATE

The U.S. Senate is the upper chamber of the United States Congress. It is composed of 100 members, with two senators from each state and two from the District of Columbia. The Senate is responsible for ratifying treaties, approving or rejecting presidential appointments, and confirming or rejecting judicial appointments. The Senate also has the power to impeach and remove federal judges and other officials.

SENATE REFORMS

There are several proposals for Senate reform, including:

1. Term Limits: Some propose limiting the number of terms a senator can serve to two.

2. Election Reform: Some propose changing the way senators are elected, such as by district or by state.
